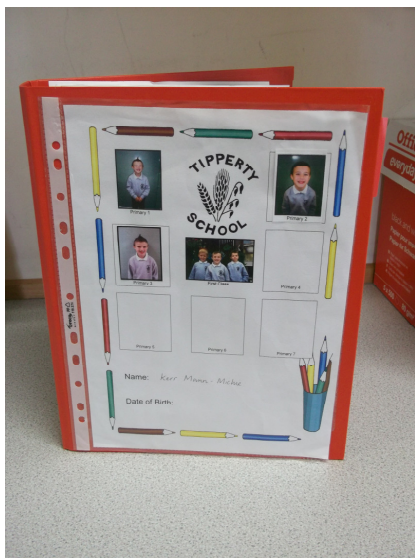

How do we recognise and share children's achievements in Tippetty School

Children's achievements and successes are recognised on a daily basis.

Celebrating Achievement

Individual, group and school successes and achievements are celebrated termly with parents and the wider community at end of term services through presentation of certificates, medals, awards and children performing and sharing their talents.

Achievement Folder

Each child has a folder to record ongoing achievements. This includes children's literacy journey, numeracy journey, learning logs, achievements in and out of school including volunteering and photographs.

Parents are welcome to look at these folders.

Primary 7 Profile

Children in Primary 7 complete a summary of their achievements prior to moving to secondary education. Children can share these with their parents.

Reporting to Parents

Parents receive a written annual report informing how well their child is progressing, next steps in their learning and how parents can help support their children's learning.
